What Are the Qualities of an Effective Ambassador?


1. Knowledge – an accurately informed mind

Knowledge of the truth




The context, more than anything, determines the meaning of the smaller unit of text.

This leads to **isolation**.


 We should inoculate, not isolate.

This leads to inoculation.





The basic problem of the Christians in this country in the last eighty years or so, in regard to society and in regard to government, is that they have seen things in bits and pieces instead of totals...





They have very gradually become disturbed over permissiveness, pornography, the public schools, the breakdown of the family, and finally abortion. But they have not seen this as a totality each thing being a part, a symptom, of a much larger problem...

They have failed to see that all of this has come about due to a shift in world view—that is, through a fundamental change in the overall way people think and view the world and life as a whole....





What we must understand is that...world views really do bring forth with inevitable certainty not only personal differences, but also total differences in regard to society, government, and law.

1. Conversational tactics

2. Making your message clear



Making Your Message Clear

• Present the truth in a clear and unambiguous way.

• Use terms that are intelligible to the listeners.

"Do you believe people who commit moral crimes ought to be punished?"

"Have you ever committed a moral crime?"

Character An Attractive Manner

A mature expression of virtue, warmth, and personal depth

Two extremes to avoid:

1. We're so nice we won't say anything that could possibly offend anyone.



2. We don't care what anyone thinks so we offend everyone.



"And the Lord's bond-servant must <u>not be quarrelsome</u>, but be <u>kind to all</u>, able to teach, <u>patient when wronged</u>, <u>with</u> <u>gentleness correcting those who are in opposition</u>, if perhaps God may grant them repentance leading to the knowledge of the truth.."

2 Timothy 2:24-25

Character in Conversation Three Powerful Phrases

1. "I could be wrong."

2. "I sympathize with your concern."

3. "That's a good point (or reasonable objection)."

Character at a Restaurant Three Rules

1. Learn the server's name and use it.

2. Leave a good tip.

3. Find your server and thank him/her before you leave.



Character When You Disagree

Three Examples to Soften Your Response

1. "I wouldn't characterize it that way. What about...?"

2. "Let me suggest an alternative and tell me if you think it's an improvement."

3. "I'm not sure I agree with the way you put it. Think about it this way..."
