



Fear in Academia: Walter's Lament

- “For twenty-two shameful classes in a row I repeated this painful process [of not sharing my faith],” Bradley said, “beginning to despair that I could ever win this fierce spiritual battle.” At long last, on the last day of class, he held on to his resolve. “Before handing out my final exams,” he said, “I was finally able to take five minutes to briefly share my faith with my students, comforted with the knowledge that I would probably not likely see them again on the large UT campus.”



Walter Bradley, on the left on stage next to his translator, speaks to students both sitting on the floor and standing about faith and science in Mexico.




Walter talked at Jinhua University in China on "Thermodynamics and the Origin of Life" in 1988, one year before the Tiananmen Square massacre.






Dr. John Pumwa and Dr. Walter Bradley demonstrating biodiesel fuel made from coconuts (2004).



MISSION




About Walter Bradley
